FAQs

How do I obtain PCR or RAT tests?

Pick up respiratory and enteric outbreak kits at HKPR Health Unit offices, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. You do **not** need to call ahead.

PPH

NEW: Call 705-743-1000 ext. 511 or email <u>infectious diseases@peterborough publichealth.ca</u> to place an order.

PCR tests require a completed respiratory requisition. Use Dr. Bocking's requisition for HKPR and Dr. Piggott's for PPH. Please also include the outbreak number provided by the health unit. Order Rapid Antigen Test kits (RAT) via the PPE Supply Portal.

What are the steps for admitting a new/hospitalized resident during outbreak?

Health Unit approval is not required for admissions/transfers **from** acute care, but consultation is recommended when IPAC advice or risk mitigation is needed. Transfers to hospital should receive Medical Transfer authorization from PTAC.

HKPR facilities can access the repatriation tool on the external LTCH/RH SharePoint site. Facilities in the PPH region can find the repatriation tool on the <u>PPH website here</u>.

When can staff return to work after illness?

Symptomatic staff should self-isolate at home and not go into work. Staff should report being ill to their employer.

Respiratory Illness

- Staff should immediately leave work and self-isolate until symptoms have been improving for 24 hours, and no fever is present.
- For 10 days after the date of symptom onset, staff should adhere to workplace measures for reducing risk of transmission (i.e., masking).

Gastrointestinal Illness

- Staff should immediately leave work.
- Depending on your facility's policies, staff may be asked not to return to work until 48 hours symptom-free.

Infectious Disease Dashboard

Stay informed about the latest infectious disease trends and outbreaks in high-risk settings. To assist with this, HKPR and Peterborough Public Health provide up-to-date data on lab-confirmed cases for 75 infectious diseases and the number of outbreaks declare.

For Peterborough County

Health Unit UPDATES

- Continue to offer COVID-19, Flu and RSV vaccines to eligible residents throughout the respiratory season.
- COVID-19, Flu and RSV can be co-administered to enable for faster protection.
- Staff should be encouraged to get vaccinated for COVID-19 and Flu. This is especially important as outbreak season tends to increase significantly after the holidays and being vaccinated ensures staff can continue to work.
- Ensure ALL doses of the COVID-19 vaccine are entered into the COVAX database.
- Store all publicly funded vaccines in an inspected fridge according to Vaccine Storage and Handling Guidelines
