What is the International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM)?

- It's the **largest event of its kind** in North America.
 - Attracting on average 70,000+ people from across Ontario, throughout Canada, the United States and beyond.
- IPM is a five-day celebration of agriculture and rural living.
- The 105th event will be held in Lindsay, Kawartha Lakes, from **October 1 to 5, 2024**





What is the International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM)?

- IPM is a collaborative effort of the Ontario Plowmen's Association and a Local Committee.
- Tourism industry estimates the economic impact of the IPM at about \$25 million annually.
- Profits generated by the IPM are donated to groups and organizations in the host communities.





What is the International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM)?

- Provincial Legislature traditionally shuts down so MPPs can attend Opening Day.
- The IPM is host to 8,000 to 12,000 students over the course of the five-day match.





Mass Gathering Events

- Require collaboration and coordination within the Health Unit and with external stakeholders.
- Potential for increase in injuries and illnesses.
- Concentrated crowds place strain on public health infrastructure and increase demands for services such as infectious disease, food and water surveillance; and campsite safety.





Mass Gathering Events

- Potential for a surge in demand on emergency medical services, the acute-care system, and public health protection activities.
- Potential for unplanned accidents, incidents or weather-related events, such as floods or acts of intentional harm, and can be associated with confrontations among and between protesters and police/security officials.





OPHS Requirements

- The board of health is ready to respond to and recover from new and emerging events and/or emergencies with public health impacts.
- The board of health shall effectively prepare for emergencies to ensure 24/7 timely, integrated, safe, and effective response to, and recovery from emergencies with public health impacts, in accordance with ministry policy and guidelines.
- Emergency Management Guideline, 2024 (ontario.ca)



Health Unit Role

- Participate on planning committees leading up to the event
- Ensure Food Safety
 - Approval of food vendors and provision of food handler training;
 - Dignitary dinner and other special meals (VIP breakfast, sponsors breakfast, lunches for plowman)
 - Inspection of food vendors;
- Drinking water
 - Monitoring water quality during the event









Health Unit Role

- Infectious Disease monitoring
 - Suspect Food and or Water Borne Illness Response
- Animal Bite Response
- Enforcement of Smoke Free Ontario Act
- Sanitary disposal of solid and liquid waste
- Will be using Incident Management System as our response structure
